Student Resources

• Student ID Cards

Your initial password will be the last four of your social security number (password must be changed on first login).

• Troy Email

Go to <http://phenix.troy.edu> and click on web mail. User name will be the same as your User ID. Your initial password will be your birth date. (mmddyyyy).

All official information, including but not limited to, student billing, faculty-student communications, registration changes and financial aid information will be sent to the student's TROY email address. • Blackboard

Admissions Information

- Prerequisites**

- Academic Advising**

All students are assigned an academic advisor who is a faculty member from the department that administers the student's declared major. New students are required to meet with their academic advisor prior to registering for the first time. - **Weekend Classes**

Business and Counseling and Psychology students must register for weekend classes at least 2 weeks prior to the first weekend class meeting. Students are responsible for getting the syllabus from the website, phenix.troy.edu and complying with all class requirements.

Please note: Textbooks for weekend classes are refundable with a receipt until the first day of class only. Check your syllabus for textbook requirements and accuracy prior to class.

Steps to Online Registration

NOTE: First semester TROY students who have not met with their advisor will not be able to register online.

1. Consult with your academic adviser and plan your schedule carefully.
2. Go to <http://phenix.troy.edu> and click on Web Express.
3. Click on the "Log In" button at the top right of the screen. If you do not know your User name click on students menu, then on "What's My User ID?"
4. After clicking "Register for Sections" the student can choose "Express Registration" or "Search and register for classes".

Express Registration

If you know the exact subject, course number, and section number of the classes for which you wish to register, select "Express Registration".

1. You can register for a course by entering the six-digit synonym number or by entering the course subject, course number and section (i.e., IS 2241 PAAU); the appropriate term for which you are registering (i.e. 09/SU). After entering all of the courses you plan to take, you may click on the "submit" button.
2. A new screen will show the results of your registration submission. You will need to click on drop down box below "Action" for each course. Choose "RGRegister" for each course and click "Submit". An error message will appear if you are ineligible to register for courses.
3. You may print your schedule by pressing the print icon on the toolbar.

Search and Register for Classes

If you do NOT know the exact subject, course number, and section for the courses for which you plan to register, click on "Search and Register for Classes". You will be able to limit your search by campus or location, term, subject, course level, instructor, and/or meeting days and times.

1. Click on the appropriate term or search start and end dates.
2. Fill out two additional fields to narrow search.
3. Click on "Submit"
4. Check the box to the left of the course that you are submitting for registration.
5. Click on "Submit"
6. A new screen will show the results of your registration submissions. Click the drop down box below "Action" and choose "RG-RG Register" for each course in which you wish to enroll. After clicking "Submit" a confirmation screen will display. An error message will appear if you are ineligible to register for courses. Contact
7. You may print your schedule by clicking the print icon on the toolbar.

Special Note: Students, who for any reason, register for classes but do not attend, MUST NOTIFY THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE IN WRITING TO WITHDRAW. Any student who fails to do so will be responsible for payment of fees.

Dropping and Withdrawing from Classes

• Dropping a Class

It is the student's full responsibility to officially drop any class or classes. Students with unconditional admission status may drop classes via Trojan Web Express. Classes may not be added or dropped at any time over the phone. After classes begin, a student wishing to drop a class must notify the Records Department in writing (either in person, by email, or via fax at 334-448-5229). If you drop below half-time status your financial aid may be reduced or cancelled, causing an overpayment that must be repaid. For more information, visit www.troy.edu/financialaid.

A \$30.00 drop fee (per class) is due at time of drop.

• Withdrawal from the University

Students withdrawing from all classes before the beginning of the semester must notify the Phenix City Campus in writing. Students withdrawing after classes have begun must obtain a Withdrawal Form from the Records Department on the first floor of the Adams Building. If you cease to be enrolled and withdraw from Troy University, all future financial aid disbursements will be terminated. Furthermore, your current disbursement may be reduced, causing an overpayment that must be repaid. For more information visit www.troy.edu/financialaid.

A \$50.00 withdrawal fee is due at time of withdrawal.

• Dropping eCampus Classes

Drop and add policies for Ft. Benning and eCampus classes may vary from Troy Phenix City policies. Please refer to the website for additional information.

Refund Policies

• Phenix City Campus Weeknight or Weekday Classes

Students who drop a class by the last day of add/drop are entitled to a refund of all tuition and fees associated with that class. Students who drop a class after the first week of classes are liable for all tuition and fees associated with that class.

Textbooks are refundable with a receipt and a signed copy of your withdrawal form within 30 days from the beginning of the semester.

• Phenix City Campus Weekend Classes

Students dropping a weekend class before the class meets are entitled to a refund for all tuition and fees associated with that class. Students may drop a weekend class after the first weekend but before the second weekend without academic penalty but will be liable for all tuition and fees associated with that class.

• eCampus Classes

Refund policies for the eCampus site vary from those of the Phenix City Campus. For the most current information, refer to troy.edu/ecampus.

• Financial Aid Students for all campuses or sites

Students receiving financial aid, who drop a class or withdraw from school after the first week of the semester, may be liable for all tuition and fees. Contact the Financial Aid Office for more information.

• Policy Statement for Payment Plan:

-3 payments of 1/3 of account balance according to the schedule below.

-Any account with a balance after May 26 is assessed a \$25 Payment Plan Fee.

Payment/Billing Procedures:

1. Prior Semester Balance: Any balance remaining from previous terms or semesters must be cleared with the Business Office before students may register for the current term.

2. Early, Regular and Late Registration: All tuition and fees are due at registration or at least 1/3 of current tuition and fees are due by Tuesday, May 26th.

3. First Statement of Charges: Students are provided with a statement of charges when they register in person. The Payment Plan Schedule appears on the statement showing amount due and dates.

(Payment Plan Fee of \$25 is not included in this schedule.)

4. Statements: Statements are sent via email to your **TROY email account** and by way of USPS (to the address in our records) prior to the scheduled payment due date.

5. Student's Responsibility: Students should monitor their account to ensure that student payments and financial aid payments have been properly applied to the account.

**** *Changes to your registration such as Adds, Drops, or Withdrawals can affect your Student Account. You are responsible for knowing university policies and adhering to the procedures for maintaining an account in good standing. * * ***

Trojan OneCard

- **How are TROY refunds delivered to students?**

Every registered TROY student will receive a Trojan OneCard. Your card will arrive in the mail at your address on file with the University. You must activate your Trojan OneCard even if you do not anticipate a refund. During card activation, you will choose how to receive your refund money. If you want faster access to your funds, simply choose to have your refunds deposited directly into your OneAccount. Activate your card and make your refund selection online at www.TrojanOneCard.com.

- **What are my options for receiving all student refunds, including financial aid refunds?**

Your options include having your refund:

1. Directly deposited to your OneAccount -Easy Refund (1 day or less).
2. Deposited to another bank of your choice (2 – 3 business days).

- **What is the OneAccount?**

The OneAccount from Higher One is a fully functioning FDIC insured FREE CHECKING account that allows you to access your student refunds quicker and easier than ever before. The OneAccount has no minimum balance, no monthly fees, and free internet banking features. With it, you can use your Trojan OneCard to make purchases anywhere Debit MasterCard® is accepted.

- **What are the advantages of having my refunds deposited directly to my OneAccount?**

1. Easy Refund (depositing your refund to your OneAccount) is the quickest way to gain access to your money. In order to have your refund directly deposited, activate your TROY OneAccount as soon as possible.
2. You can use the Trojan OneCard as a debit card (NOT A CREDIT CARD) to make purchases at all Debit MasterCard locations, access cash at an ATM, pay bills, send money electronically and so much more.
3. There is no charge to you for receiving your refund directly in your TROY OneAccount. There is no monthly fee or minimum balance for the OneAccount.

- **How will I know when my refund has been deposited to my OneAccount?**

You will receive an e-mail when your refund has been directly deposited to your OneAccount. Additionally, you will be able to see details of your OneAccount by accessing your OneAccount Statement on the website.

- **Can I have my refund deposited to another bank account?**

If you choose to have your refund deposited to a bank of your choice, this transfer may take 2-3 business days from the day the University releases the funds. In order to have your refund deposited to your bank, you must first activate your Trojan OneCard at www.TrojanOneCard.com. For this option, you will need to complete, print and mail the third party form to the designated address. This form is available on www.TrojanOneCard.com.

- **Can I select a paper check instead?**

No. However if you selected this option prior to May 15, 2008, you may continue to receive your funds in this manner.

- **Why is the Debit MasterCard® logo on the new Trojan OneCard?**

The Trojan OneCard is the card you use to access your funds if you choose to accept the OneAccount. With the Debit MasterCard logo on it, you can use the card as a debit card wherever Debit MasterCard® is accepted. The card is NOT a credit card. It is a DEBIT card.

- **What will happen to my refund if I don't activate my Trojan OneCard?**

TROY will not be able to disburse your refund to you. Regardless of whether you anticipate that you will receive a refund, it is important to activate your card and choose a refund preference at www.TrojanOneCard.com.

- **What do I do if I did not receive my Trojan OneCard in the mail?**

You may log on to www.TrojanOneCard.com and use the "Where's my Card" self help feature that will provide you with the real time status of your card. Or, you may visit the Card Office located in your TROY Business Office.

- **What if I have additional questions?**

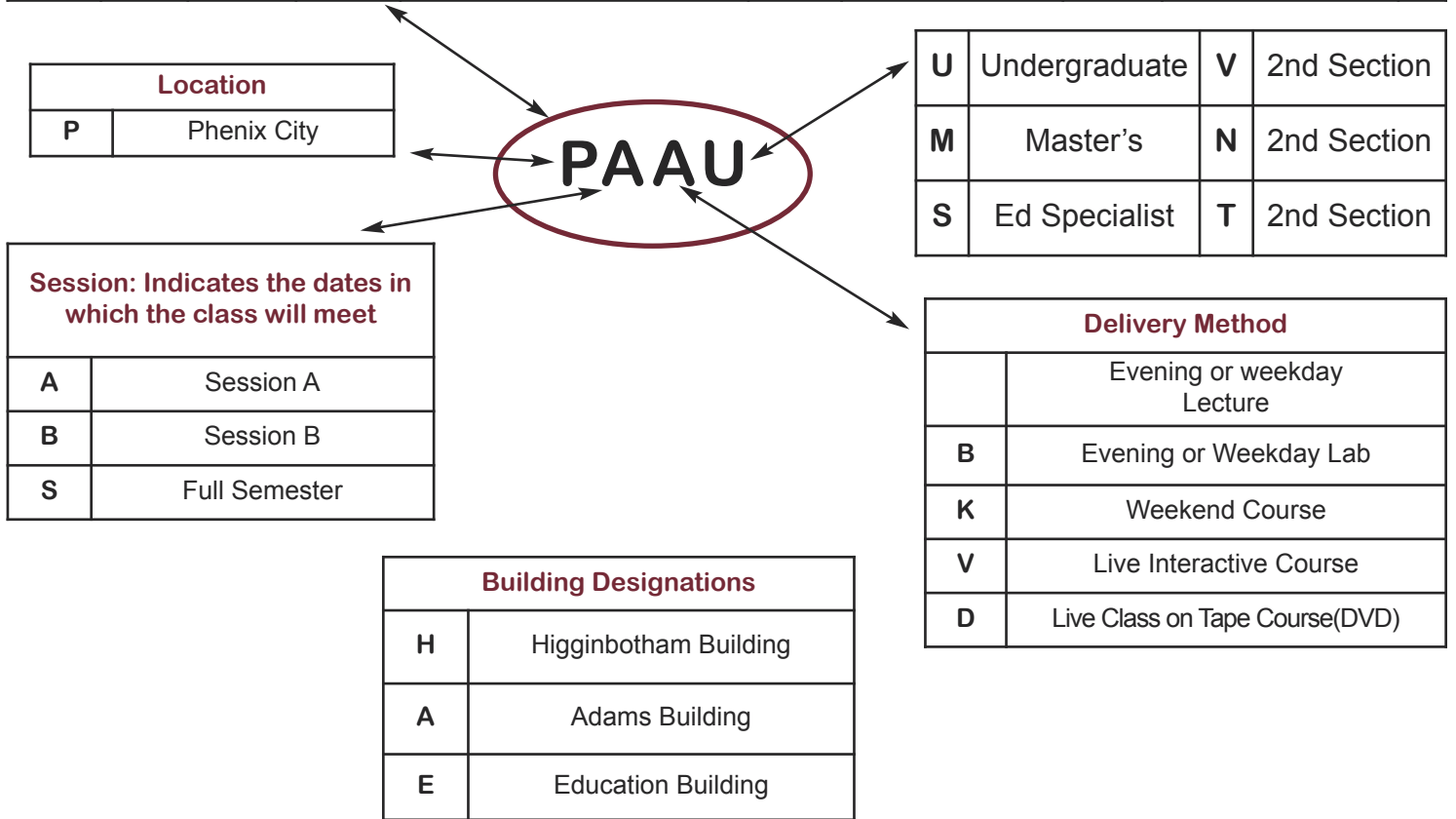
